

Music is a universal language that has the power to inspire and move us.

Throughout history, composers and musicians have found inspiration in the world all around them, using the beauty of nature to make melodies and instruments that make people feel something. The sounds of nature have influenced and shaped musical compositions in many genres!

Masters of classical music and modern composers have left a mark on the world of music. In the past, composers like Ludwig van Beethoven, Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart, and Antonio Vivaldi have been inspired by the natural world in their music. Beethoven's "Pastoral Symphony" captures the sounds of a countryside landscape, with its flowing melodies and gentle harmonies to make us feel like we have been transported to a peaceful countryside.


Nature's influence on music is not only in the music written by composers in history, or in the instruments created. Musicians today still use music to inspire their sound. Folk, country, and bluegrass music also incorporate themes of nature, and reflect the bond between rural communities and nature!



Classical Pieces Inspired by Nature



Composers have been inspired by animals, and others by beautiful places they have seen. Scan the QR codes to listen to some of the music from famous composers that are nature- inspired!




Jean-Philippe Rameau: 6 Concerts transcrits en sextuor: I. La poule

Can you guess what this piece is inspired by? That's right – a hen! Birds, with their beautiful songs and calls, have inspired many pieces of classical music. Hens don't make noise in notes of equal lengths. See if you can hear that inspiration when you listen!

Beethoven: Symphony No. 6, 'Pastoral'

This piece was written to sound like the journey a person takes when they are leaving the hustle and bustle of the city, and leaving for the peaceful energy of the countryside. When you listen, can you imagine you are on this journey?






Messiaen: Le merle noir

This piece uses the song of the blackbird, or 'le merle noir', for inspiration! Massiaen was a composer most known for his music inspired by bird songs. Listen to his piece and see what you hear. When you go outside, listen for the bird songs all around you!









Nikolai Rimsky-Korsakov: Flight of the **Bumblebee**

You may have heard this piece before. When you hear the music, what do you see? How do you feel? This song was composed to mimic the quickly changing flying pattern of a bumblebee! Next time you see a bumblebee, imagine they are flying to this tune.

Vivaldi: Four Seasons

This work has four sections (concertos), and each section makes you feel like you are experiencing the seasons: Spring, Summer, Winter, Fall. The finale of 'Summer' has a thunderstorm using string concertos, rushing string scales, and pounding cellos and basses. Which season is your favorite as you listen?





Gustav Holst: The Planets


Each movement of this piece is named after a planet of the Solar System and its astrological character. For example, Mars, the Bringer of War, sounds angry with a pulsing drum beat, followed by Venus, the Bringer of Peace, where the music is slow and relaxing with harps and flutes.

Instruments Made from Nature







Ancient Greek Pipes

If there's one thing the Ancient Greeks could agree on, it was a love of music! The Auloi were musical pipes made from wood, bone, or even metal. A reed was inserted in the mouthpiece, and the pipes were blown into just like many modern instruments.

Maraca

Some natural instruments, like maracas, are still used throughout modern music. They appear mostly Caribbean and Latin Music. This simple but effective instrument is a dried gourd, and all you have to do is shake!





Hulusi


Coming from China, the hulusi is another instrument made from a gourd. They usually have three pipes, and you blow into the top. Some of them have keyed finger holes, like a clarinet or saxophone, which can broaden the flute's range to several octaves!




Instruments Made from Nature

Shofar

Made from a ram's horn, this instrument is used in synagogue services during the Jewish celebration of Rosh Hashanah. It makes a trumpeting sound, and using the shofar during ceremonies goes at least as far back as Biblical times!






Rasp

This instrument is still used today in country and folk music! It's made by rubbing a stick across the roughness of many materials. Historically, things like turtle shells were used; a washboard is the modern version!

Shekere

This is a West African percussion instrument made of dried gourd with a woven netting of beads. The instrument is commonly used in West African and Latin American music and can also be heard in many popular forms of music!



Conch

Conch shells were used in many different cultures' important occasions and ceremonies. The shell itself comes from a large marine snail, and can be used to make a warm, full, and far-carrying sound, just as it is in nature!

Our festival has three concerts inspired by nature! "Explore the _______", at Cherry Springs State Park is a free concert, where a brass quintet will play under the stars. Another nature inspired concert is at the Deane Center in Wellsboro, where a harpist and two violinists star in a performance called "From the Forests of La Plata to the Meadows of Bohemia". Our last nature inspired concert is called "Under the Summer Sky", where the brass quintet will perform a piece about the August sun and blue skies.
